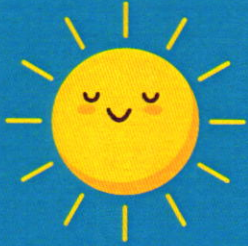

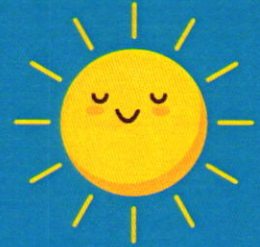

## 4-H Poultry BBQ Clinic

Adair County 4-H hosted a 4-H Poultry BBQ Clinic for 17 youth on July 9. Dr. Jacquie Jacob, Poultry Extension Associate, taught the youth how to grill using charcoal. The youth prepared two chicken thighs with bone in and skin on and turkey burgers. Youth learned the proper skills necessary to successfully prepare the food on a charcoal grill. 12 of the youth stated they had never cooked using a charcoal grill. At the end of the clinic, each youth had lunch with what they had prepared.

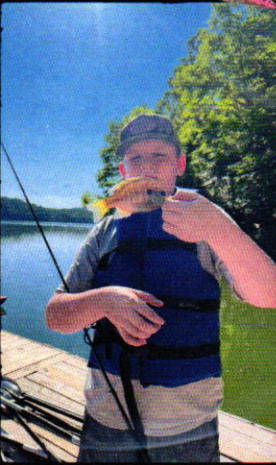
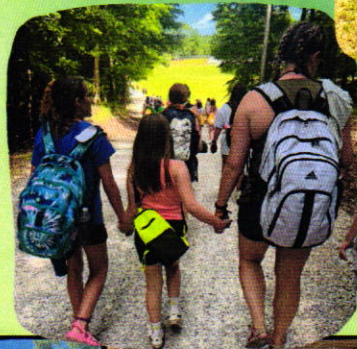

# 4-H CAMP!

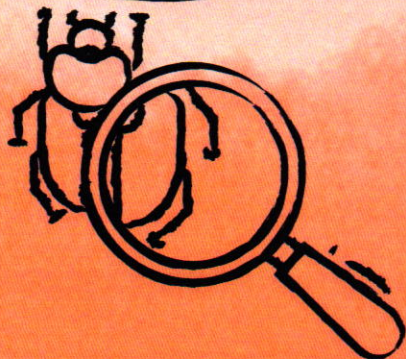
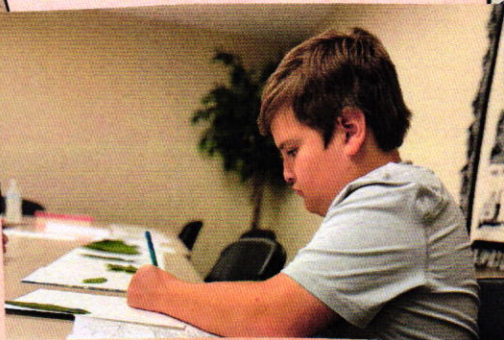

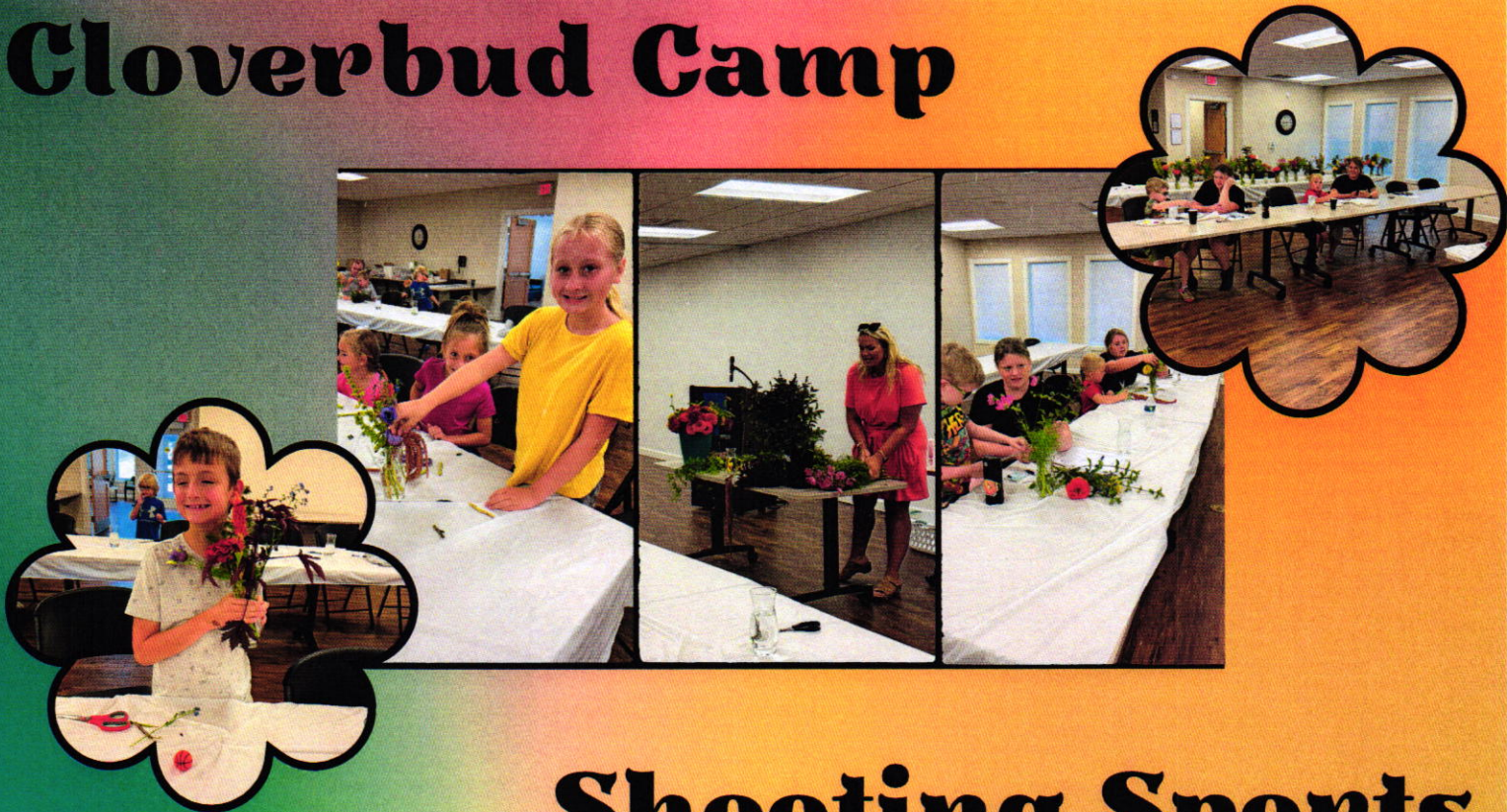


## **4-H OUTDOOR CLUB HELD A FAMILY FISHING DAY**
